

FRAZIER ELEMENTARY STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE FOR STUDENTS

ACCEPTABLE-GENERAL

- ✓ All clothing must be a solid color, without holes and free of visible stains.
- ✓ Parents are strongly urged to label their child's clothing.

UNACCEPTABLE

No caps, hats, or scarves.
No printed words (logos or skulls) allowed on any clothing (shirts, pants, etc.).
No jewelry, lanyards, or accessory that is oversized, distracting, or used as a toy.
Chokers are not allowed.

ACCEPTABLE SHIRTS, SWEATERS, VESTS, SWEATSHIRTS:

- ✓ The **only** acceptable colors are: POLO style (3 button, collared) **White, Dark Blue, Powder (light) Blue, Red, Dark Green – solid colors only.**
- ✓ Shirts must be tucked in for grades 1-5 (does not include sweatshirts).
- ✓ The **only** acceptable shirts are: **solid color shirts with collars.**
- ✓ Sweatshirts, sweaters and vests (worn over collared shirts) must be: **White, Dark Blue, Light Blue, Red, or Dark Green – solid colors only.**
- ✓ Students may also wear any shirt **purchased at school**, during the week. (Field Day, Spirit shirts from past years or Fun Run)
- ✓ Frazier Spirit Day is Friday

ACCEPTABLE OUTERWEAR

- ✓ There are no restrictions on all-weather coats, lightweight jackets, or coats worn outside of the building and stored in the coat cabinet.
- ✓ **Sweaters worn inside the building should meet the same color requirements as shirts, sweaters, vests and sweatshirts. The only acceptable colors are White, Dark Blue, Red, or Dark Green – solid colors only.**

UNACCEPTABLE

No oversized sweatshirts, crop tops, material designed to be form fitting (such as spandex or sheer), shirts with colored trim, shirts with logos, t-shirts, or sleeveless shirts.

ACCEPTABLE PANTS/SHORTS/JUMPERS/SKIRTS/SKORTS/DRESSES

- ✓ The **only** acceptable colors – **Dark Blue, Khaki, Black or Blue Denim – solid colors only.**
- ✓ All pants must be ankle length and fit at the waist and crotch..
- ✓ Pants must be of solid colors.
- ✓ All pants and shorts must be properly hemmed or cuffed.
- ✓ Shorts must be no more than 4" above the knee.
- ✓ Jumpers, skirts, skorts and dresses must be no more than 4" above the knee.

UNACCEPTABLE

No overalls (pants and shorts), leggings, sweatpants or workout shorts, or pants/jeans with inappropriate designs.

ACCEPTABLE SHOES, SOCKS

- ✓ Tennis shoes or shoes with closed heels and toes are allowed.
- ✓ Solid color socks or tights in White, Black, Dark Blue, Red or Dark Green colors only are allowed.

LEGGINGS AND TIGHTS

- ✓ May be worn with appropriate shorts, skirts, or dresses (all must be no more than 4" above the knee)

UNACCEPTABLE

No jellies, flip flops, sandals, backless shoes, shoes with heels higher than one inch, "heelies" tennis shoes, or boots that cover pants.

ACCEPTABLE SPIRIT DAY CLOTHING

- ✓ Wednesdays are for free dress pass with standardized bottoms.
- ✓ Un-tuck shirt passes may be used any day.

FREE DRESS DAY

- ✓ Free dress will be allowed on individual picture day in the spring. Free dress pass clothing should follow district dress guidelines.
- ✓ Brownie/Girl Scout and Cub Scout/Boy Scout uniforms may be worn on meeting days.

ALL OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS AS DEFINED IN THE DISTRICT STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT BOOK REGARDING DRESS AND GROOMING WILL APPLY.

VIOLATIONS AND CONSEQUENCES

First Semester:

1. First Violation - verbal warning given to student. Correct clothing will be provided by clinic and returned the next day to the clinic.
2. Second Violation - written notification sent to parent. Correct clothing will be provided by clinic and returned at the end of the day.
3. Third Violation - office referral (working lunch and recess).

Second Semester:

1. First violation - written notification sent to parent. Correct clothing will be provided by clinic and returned the next day to the clinic.
2. Second violation – office referral (working lunch and recess).

Additional Information

Economic Assistance: “A student who is economically disadvantaged and unable to comply with the dress requirements because of an economic hardship may qualify for clothing assistance.” Please contact our school nurse at 713-896-3480 for additional information.

Transfer Requests: “Parents may request a transfer to another campus that does not require standardized dress. The transfer will be granted on a space-available basis. Parents must provide transportation.”

Exemption Requests: “Parents may request an exemption to the dress guidelines for a bona fide religious or philosophical reason. The objection must be submitted in writing to the principal for consideration.”
